Our guest speaker today was Frank White, the Revolving Fund Director of The Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation. In sharing with us about The Georgia Trust, the following points were included in his remarks:

1. The Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation was chartered in 1973 as a nonprofit preservation organization to preserve and enhance Georgia's communities and their diverse historic resources for the education and enjoyment of all.
2. The Georgia Trust established the Revolving Fund in 1990 to provide effective alternatives to demolition or neglect by promoting their rehabilitation and monitoring their preservation in perpetuity.
3. Properties selected by the Revolving Fund Committee must meet the criteria of being Endangered, Significant, Obtainable, Marketable, and Locally Supported.
4. After approving a prospective property for participation, The Trust can acquire it by Donation, a Bargain Sale, and Option to Purchase, or by a Fee Simple Purchase.
5. Since 1982, The Georgia Trust has helped rehabilitate more than 3,000 properties which include Waycross City Hall, Newnan Presbyterian Church, Boys High School Lofts, and Spelman College's Sisters Chapel.
6. Major sources of revenue for operating The Georgia Trust are membership subscription and fundraisers such as Golf Tournaments and Balls.
